A Tribute to Richard Wayne Ranshaw April 19, 1931-January 5, 2014

Our hearts are heavy as we read the news Rev. Sue sent to us on a cold, blistery day in this New Year. Then I think back to the Prayer Partners' meeting right after Dick entered the

hospital, seems like ages ago. Rev. Sue told us of her hospital visit with Joanne and Dick in ICU. Rev. Sue informed us that when Dick realized she was there he called her over to the bed and informed her that either way, it was a win-win situation. If he lived, he would be with his family. If he died, he would live with God. "Either way, I just can't lose," Dick told Rev. Sue. What a wonderful memory to hold in our hearts!

Memories of Dick Ranshaw

From Salem's August 2012 Newsletter, "Do You Know Who This Is?"

Richard (Dick) Ranshaw was born on Neville Island, Pennsylvania. Yes, there is an island in Pennsylvania, right smack dab in the middle of the Ohio River, six miles south of Three River Stadium, home of the Pittsburg Pirates and maybe the Steelers. He moved to Wilmington, Delaware in 1941 as his father was to be in charge of building destroyer ships for World War II. After the war they moved back to Pennsylvania in 1948 (his senior year of High School) where his Pop built steamboats, etc. He enlisted in the army in 1952 and three months later was sent to Korea. He came home from Korea as a Sergeant first class with two bronze stars, a purple heart and some other medals. One week after returning, he got married with everyone's approval. He graduated from California State Teachers College, received his Masters Degree in Guidance Counseling from West Virginia University. He also attended American University in D.C., taught Industrial Arts (woodworking) at Wheaton High School and was Guidance Counselor at North Bethesda Junior High for fourteen years. He was Guidance Counselor at Sherwood High School until 1997. He has three sons and one daughter, eight grandchildren, three stepgrandchildren and one great-grandson. Oh yes, he married a "real peach of a girl," named Joanne on July 17, 1954.

From Salem's 180th Anniversary:

"How has Salem blessed you?"

Dick recognized that he was a blessed man. He shared this with Rev. Sue who included these $\mathsf{Page}\ 2$

words in her sermon on May 31, 2013. "By faith, he and Joanne began attending Salem in 1964-5. They came because there was a youth fellowship for their children. But when Dick met Clyde Unglesbee, he knew they would stay. Clyde greeted his family with an 'open heart and was very accepting with a lot of grace.' When Dick was 19 years old, he was baptized and he said, 'God got hold of him and never let him go.' Dick believes that God had given him a call to give a witness of what he was getting from his faith, to share with others how God works things out in one's life, and how God directs one's life. So he served as a Lay Speaker and Sunday School teacher for 50 years! This was his way to give back to God and contribute to the church. Through these 50 years of study and teaching, Dick has learned that Jesus never sinned, but died for his [Dick's] sins. His life's goal is to model Jesus - to emulate Him to the best of his ability in his life. The best and biggest change he has seen in Salem was hiring Janet [Craswell]. He said that with her giftedness and creativity, she has blessed this church and God glorifies her work."

Dick served the church in many ways, from repairing the "garage door" to being a Sunday School teacher, Lay Speaker, Lay Leader and so many jobs in between they are too numerous to name. Though Dick had severe back pain, he never complained. We will all miss Dick's friendly and warm greeting he gave to everyone: children, youth, and adults, but Dick is receiving his reward as Jesus says, "Well done, good and faithful servant!"

Where there is a concern about the impending weather (such as freezing rain and heavy snowfall) that might affect the congregation's coming to the church, Salem Trustee Chair and Pastor review weather forecasts and decide whether they should cancel the worship services early on Sunday.

"A retired minister reflected upon his life and identified three stages of ministry. In the first, he was a spectator sitting on the shore and shouting instructions to those struggling in the current. In the second, he was a lifeguard, still shouting instructions, but sometimes entering the water to embrace someone who was going down. In the third, he himself was thrown into the deep, only to discover the grace of others'

strength and support. He wrote, 'In the admission of great weakness, I found great strength. In willingness to be helped, I became a better helper.' With your help at Salem I moved beyond the second stage of my ministry. Thank you."
