#### A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR



At the end of this month (May 31-June 3), Mark Aebig and I will be attending a very important event in the life of our church called "Annual Conference." Our Annual Conference is "Baltimore-Washington." The phrase "Annual Conference" can refer to three things in the UMC: our regional body, our organizational body, and our yearly "Annual Conference sessions." Here are some excerpts from umc.org about it:

### **Regional body**

The annual (sometimes referred to as 'regional') conference is described by the church's Constitution and (other parts of the) Book of Discipline as the "basic unit" of the church. In the United States, an annual conference may cover an entire state, only part of the state, or even parts of two or more states. [...] The United States has 54 annual conferences, supervised by bishops in 46 episcopal areas. There are 75 annual conferences in Africa, Europe, and the Philippines, which are supervised by 20 bishops.

#### **Organizational body**

In the U.S., the annual conference has a central office and professional staff that coordinate and conduct ministry and the business of the conference. [...]

## Annual Conference sessions

Each year an equal number of clergy members and lay members attend their conference's annual conference session for worship, fellowship, and to conduct the business of the conference, which may last 3-5 days. These sessions include reports of past and ongoing work; adoption of future goals, programs and budgets; ordination of clergy members as deacons and elders; and election of delegates to Jurisdictional and General Conferences (every 4 years). The bishop presides over these meetings.

To me, however, attending Annual Conference (the 3-day meeting!) is so much more than a chance to conduct business. It's a time to see other clergy I love, a chance to know what's happening with the future of the denomination I've grown up in, and some of the most beautiful worship I'll attend all year.

Every year our church sends the pastor and a lay delegate. Our delegate will vote on your behalf on all the above issues. Buck Bartley is normally our delegate. However, he has asked to step down and Mark was willing to take his place. If you would like to know more about the issues that will come up at Annual Conference this year, you can go to bwcumc.org, navigate to the "events" tab, and click on "2023 Annual Conference." Alternately, you can type

annualconference/ into your search bar. The right hand side of the screen will show "Quick Links" you can explore. I suggest "Resolutions," and "Stewardship Reports and Recommendations" to see things Mark and I will be voting on. For more detail on our specific Annual Conference session, you can download the "2023 Annual Conference Primer." It has information on our theme, who can vote, disaffiliation, and UMC terms. Being part of a church that connects like this is such a blessing. I love attending Annual Conference and being part of a larger denomination.

## LEADERSHIP TEAM UPDATE

At April's meeting the Leadership team reported an Easter service attendance of 44 people. Pastor Emily said it was one of the most attended services since her appointment to Salem. She also says that more people are coming to Salem to worship our Lord. We are grateful the numbers are rising.

The team reviewed Salem's first quarter financial records and are happy to report there is a surplus in the budget. Good news for a church of Salem's size.

Salem's two outreach programs, The Lord's Table and Lunch for Six are successfully helping people meet and eat though in different contexts.

Playground Day Outreach will happen after schools release students for summer. We will need help from the congregation to help coordinate and supervise the youth who will be doing the work. Prayerfully consider getting involved.

Wednesday Night Dinner won't start until the Fall. Pastor Emily wants to do a three or

four meal trial and evaluate the efforts before making it an ongoing outreach. The menu will most likely be mac 'n' cheese and chicken nuggets to appeal to the kids. Pastor Emily will develop activities to do during dinner. We will need volunteers to help with this outreach. Again, prayerfully consider getting involved.

The team voted unanimously to absorb the Cemetery Committee responsibilities under its umbrella of services. This is an internal matter, and the Team is considering ways to do this and modernize the record keeping without disrupting and planned burials.
