Samantha Larson, the 2016-2017 Wesley Theological Seminary intern at Salem UMC, is in her final year of Seminary. In addition to being in school and an intern at Salem, Sam is pursuing ordination through the Virginia United Methodist Conference to become a pastor. Sam grew up in

the Shenandoah Valley of Virginia where most of her family still resides. She attended Eastern Mennonite University to study nursing. At the end of her degree, Sam decided to pursue a year-long volunteer experience with a ministry in Washington, DC that incorporated both her nursing and ministry skills. After working at Joseph's House, a hospice for homeless men and women with AIDS for a year, Sam realized her calling was in ministry. After working as a mission and outreach coordinator at an Episcopal church the following year, Sam decided to begin the ordination process in the United Methodist Church as well as apply to seminary. She began at Wesley in 2013 directly after marrying her husband, Alex, that August. She looks forward to her time at Salem UMC, to learning with and from the congregation, as well as having the congregation learn from her. Alex, Sam's husband, will also be attending Salem UMC with her on Sundays and helping out as he is able. Alex is a licensed social worker currently working at NMS Healthcare in Hyattesville, MD. ## ASP 2016



Appalachia Service Project 2016 -Logan County WV

Our two Salem ASP work crews departed for Logan County West Virginia early on Sunday June 19. Our destination, Chapmanville Middle School, would be our home for the next week. Upon arrival we unpacked, met the center staff and settled-in to the classrooms where we would sleep. We were then assigned our projects that would keep us busy for the next week.

Project # 1: This crew consisted of adults: Barbara Achstetter, Hisashi Yamagata, David Ranshaw, and youth: Jacob Weinberger, Kenny Wahl, Donovan Thompson and Sandy Chandradasa. Their project was to help a family who had not had electricity or running water in their house for almost two years. They also needed drywall repair where a ceiling was falling down. David, our master electrician, got to work restoring power to the house while the rest of the crew worked on the drywall repairs. Because water was supplied by an electric well pump, when electricity was restored, running water was also restored. Unfortunately, since the water had not been running for so long, the water heater tank had rusted-out and it leaked. It would have to be replaced by a following crew. By the end of the week the new drywall was installed and the family once again had electricity and running water in their house.

**<u>Project #2</u>**: This crew consisted of adults: Bob Brown, Libby Wright, Danielle Van Horn, and youth: Amy Roberts, Wyatt Thompson, Joey Brantly and Cameron Dougherty. Their assignment was to replace floors in a home that had been flooded. They began in a bathroom and bedroom. The particle board subfloor had disintegrated when it got wet and the only thing holding the floor together was the vinyl covering. The crew began by removing the old floor. Then they installed new insulation and a new sub-floor. Finally they installed laminate plank flooring in the bedroom and vinyl composite tile (vct) in the bathroom. By the end of the week this part of the home had a new beautiful and safe floor. Additional work crews would follow to continue the re-flooring throughout the whole house.

The 2016 Salem ASP team would like to thank everyone for their support. We can always count on our Salem family to go "above and beyond" to make this important mission possible. Because of your generous support, we were not only able to fund our work crews but we were also able to donate extra money toward the replacement of the leaking water heater tank for project #1 and for a new toilet and vanity for project #2. These items were not included in ASP's budget for these projects.

To hear and see more about this amazing week of making homes warmer, safer and drier, please join us for ASP Sunday, September 24 2016 at both the 8:15 and 10:00 worship services.

### **CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING**

Church Council Meeting Highlights August 18, 2016

- + Bill Lavely opened the meeting with devotion.
- Rev. Sue reported on worship attendance. The average for June was 55, July was 47 and the Year to Date is 59.
- + Joys were shared about members enjoying summer, and vacations, and returning to church!
- We pray for Mary Ellen Eaton, Rose Eide Altman, Chuck Sterling, Curt Smith, and Josh Beebee after recent hospitalizations and surgeries.
- We continue to work on our goals for the year. Goal #1 is increasing church attendance. We will connect our Stewardship Campaign with this goal. Our campaign theme is "Why I Love my Church." Please be thinking about your reasons for loving Salem.
- Goal #2 is expand our outreach to the community. We have a number of ideas that are being investigated including: articles in the Olney Newspaper, free coffee and donuts for commuters once a

month, book club at the Olney Library, new t-shirts, and ways we could serve the town of Brookeville. Input from the congregation is welcome and encouraged. Stay tuned!!

- + Sunday school and our Stewardship campaign will both begin on September 11.
- + The OURI Korean church is no longer meeting at Salem. We considered and approved a request by Rev. Paul Park to use Salem on Sunday afternoons for a new church start-up.
- + We received a report of our account balances. All 3 of our investment accounts recorded profits in the second quarter!
- Bill Lavely shared the organizations who received donations from Flo Johnston's gift to Salem. They are: Our House, Mary's House (DC) and the General Board of Global Ministries for a special program that trains women to care for older adults.
- Connie Somerville shared the priorities determined by the Trustees for the use of Flo Johnston's estate for church maintenance and improvement projects. These include:
  - 1. Bell tower, breezeway and eaves carpentry and painting
  - 2. Cupola on the Community Hall repair and painting
  - 3. Roof inspection and estimates for repair/replacement
  - 4. Interior painting and carpet
  - 5. Rewire breezeway with LED
- Hasashi Yamagata shared work of the SPRC. Rev. Sue's yearly goals have been discussed and reviewed. Our Registered Sex Offender Policy is almost complete. Hasashi will be putting our Safe Sanctuaries records on a data base and working with SPRC members to complete required background checks.
- The Cemetery Committee has completed their work on our updated Cemetery Policy. This will be mailed out to all current owners of cemetery plots.

Joyce Howes reported recent expenditures from the Memorials accounts.

Buck Bartley closed the meeting with prayer.

Pastor Sue asked if Salem could be of further assistance through volunteering or providing other support and they were going to consider how we might help in the future.

restock their supplies. Donations to purchase items for the kits will be greatly appreciated.

**Flood Buckets:** We would like to send flood buckets to UMCOR too so their stock can be replaced. More information on how they can be assembled will be forthcoming.
