

To the Salem UM Church Community, **Building Spiritual Muscles: Accountable Discipleship**

"Practice makes perfect" is a cliché that means if we do something over and over again we will learn to do it well. Sport teams practice every day so they can win games. Musicians practice so their music is perfect. Those who are on stage practice so they know their parts for a performance. Have you ever considered the need to practice one's faith? Following Jesus is more than just coming to church on Sundays. It is making Jesus the center of every part of one's life. And that takes practice. We tend to fail at this easily and move ourselves to the center. This is why we need coaches or team meetings to

encourage us to keep on practicing and to help us discern how we can better serve Jesus every day.

John Wesley saw practicing our faith and checking in with each other on a regular basis as the building blocks of faith development. He strongly encouraged everyone who became part of his revival movement to be in a small group which he called a class meeting. These small groups met weekly to check in with each other to see how people were being successful at living their faith or being challenged. These groups were not Bible Study or prayer groups. Sometimes they may have included some study or prayer, but basically they were check-in times. One of the questions they would ask each other was, "How goes it with your soul?"

Being a part of a small group like the class meeting can help a follower of Jesus develop spiritual muscles. With the help of others in the group, our faith can grow deeper in Christ and wider into the world. These groups are called accountability groups. Each group develops their own discipleship covenant that they promise to uphold. They agree to meet regularly, usually weekly, for one hour. Each group decides on what areas of discipleship they need to work on. Some

may choose to be held accountable in the areas of worship, devotion, compassion, and justice. Another may choose the areas of presence, prayers, gifts, service, and witness.

As we move into the Easter Season and discovering our new life in Christ, these accountability groups can not only breathe new life into our personal lives as disciples, but they can also breathe new life into our church and community. Would you consider participating in one of these groups?

THE REASON FOR GOD: Brief in the Age of **Skepticism** by Timothy Keller. Non-fiction.

Timothy Keller, the founding pastor of Redeemer Presbyterian Church in New York City, addresses the frequent doubts that skeptics, and even ardent believers, have about religion. Using literature, philosophy, real-life conversations, and potent reasoning, Keller explains how the belief in a Christian God is, in fact, a sound and rational one. To true believers he offers a solid platform on which to stand their ground against the backlash to religion created by Age of Skepticism. And to skeptics, atheists, and agnostics, he provides a challenging argument for pursuing the reason for God.
