To the Salem UM Church Community,

I love snow days when I don't have to be traveling in the weather and can stay inside where it is warm. There are two things that I love about snow days. First, I love looking out the window, seeing the beauty of the snow as it clings to the trees and bushes, and savoring God's created world. Second, snow days provide opportunities for a slower day in which one can relax. Snow days are great days to take care for one's soul.

Our Epiphany season worship has been focused on the process of making holy connections through our soul. This process is based on the seven steps outlined in a book written by Rev. Kirk Bryon Jones, *Soul Talk*. These steps are: 1) Be Still, 2) Lay Burdens Down, 3) Listen Deeply, 4) Don't Run Away, 5) Be Honest, 6) Be Gentle, 7) Welcome New Truth. Each Sunday we are focusing on one or two of these steps in the order listed. Here are some of the things we have learned about Soul Talk so far.

Jones mentions that our soul is always waiting to talk with us, but won't compete with all the noise around us. We have to silence our minds and set aside or unburden ourselves of things we must do or concerns we have. This helps us to stop thinking. Then our non-thinking will be ready to receive new thoughts from that holy space within, our soul, where God is waiting for us to listen. Rev. Jones also speaks about the soul being a "hidden

reservoir of limitless wisdom, peace, and joy." Yet, we tend to steer away from dipping into this reservoir and satiating our thirst for the Holy. Instead, we satiate this thirst with busy-ness. Jones also mentions that the voice of our soul is a soft voice because a "whisper encourages more concentrated effort to pay attention. Your soul may speak low so you can listen high."

If you want to learn more about this process of holy connections, you can purchase Jones' book online. Or simply try these steps to see what the Spirit in your souls has for you. Connecting with the Holy through Soul Talk is not only a process, but also takes practice. I invite you to quiet all your electronic devices, find a place and time where you can be quiet, and allow yourself to get in touch with your soul, that connection point with God's Spirit. What might you discover or uncover there? God is waiting for you!

These five statements, found on the walk into the Apartheid Museum in Johannesburg, South Africa, reveal much about us as humans and how we interact with each other. South Africa, too, has much to reveal to us here in the United States. It's where we find some of our oldest human ancestors, where we can see clearly the impact that slavery and organized systems of oppression have on a country, and where we learn the courage and endurance required to fight for what's right and build a place where all of us walkers, thinkers, fighters, gazers, and storytellers can live life abundant together.

Come hear reflections on the legacy of apartheid and what South Africa is like

today, twenty-five years after the fall of apartheid as Salem UMC's seminary intern, Jo Schonewolf, unpacks her recent trip to South Africa. The presentation promises penguins, giraffes, and some heartfelt thoughts about what we can take away from South Africa's story.

The Network: The Story of the Underground Railroad

On Monday, January 21 members of our congregation and many from our community met in Salem's Community Salem News February 2019 Hall for a very informative talk presented by Ms. Natalie Williams, an educator and a member of the Board of Directors for The Sandy Spring Slave Museum and African Art Gallery, who shared with us history and other information about the function of the Underground Railroad, stories of enslaved African Americans from Maryland and Montgomery County, and shared her own family connection to the Railroad.



Stories of slaves hiding during the day and traveling at night, sometimes not knowing if they will find friendly help along the way. Most informative and heart breaking.

Mr. Reginal Smith brought a quilt that was used as a directional signal helping the escapees along their journey to freedom. It was a reminder to many of Israel's escape from Egypt.
