A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR



As you may know General Conference 2020 finally took place this April (even though it's 2024!). Our delegates made many decisions on our behalf. To read the official UMC update, check out UMNews.org.

The purpose of General Conference is to set budgets to fund ministries, establish rules and policies, and make decisions for the larger United Methodist Church. While the GC is always filled with worship, many years it has been fraught with tension and deep social disagreement.

This year was different. There was deep sadness over disaffiliation, but also more hope than I've ever seen in a GC. UMNews says this is arguably the most consequential GC since 1968 when we convened to create the United Methodist church.

After the delegates considered more than 1,000 petitions, here's an overview of the decisions made:

- Removed the prohibition against gay clergy
- Removed prohibition against same gender weddings
- Approved the budget for the next four years
- Approved a new clergy pension plan
- Granted deacons sacramental authority in their ministry setting
- Agreed to be "in full communion" with the Episcopal church
- Approved some Eurasian annual conferences to leave and become the "Christian Methodist Church"
- Reduced the number of US bishops from 39 to 32
- Approved regionalization petitions that will allow other Central Conferences to make contextual decisions for their ministry

While many are happy (these votes largely passed with huge majorities), some believe we spent too much time in an echo chamber and didn't spend time thinking about what the loss of so many churches will mean for us as a denomination. Bishop Will Willimon reminds us in an article titled "Missed Opportunities at the UMC general conference" that our US church is 96% white and 62% over 50. He is afraid we spent too much time looking ahead ambiguously without enough creative self-reflection on how we will reach out to other generations and demographics.

Overall, General Conference marks a new step in our denomination. However, it's important than we spend our time focusing on what God has called us, Salem UMC in Brookeville, to do. Continue to love and welcome all, and I think we're on the right track.

Olney HELP Food Needs

You may leave non-perishable food donations in the box under the table in the sanctuary or in the marked box in the Community Hall. Most needed items include non-perishable snacks for kids over Spring break, canned fruit (in juice), peanut butter (16 oz. smooth), cold cereal (kids and adult), canned pasta, snacks for kids, pancake mix and pancake syrup. Also, canned fruit (in juice please), canned pasta, shelf stable bottled juice, frosting for all our cake mixes (we provide cake mix, frosting, candles, cupcake holders and sprinkles for the kids birthdays), pancake mix, canned chili, canned chicken, sloppy joe sauce, canned tomatoes (prefer low salt), adult cereal, spaghetti sauce -plain kind, canned meats, such as tuna, chicken, turkey, corned beef, spam, salmon, Vienna sausage, etc.;, 1 lb. bags of rice and rice sides (Knorr/Roni), pasta sides (Knorr/Roni), baked beans, canned green beans, corn, peas (low/no salt), Jelly - all sizes, all flavors, condiments - BBQ sauce, ketchup, mustard, salad dressing; instant mashed potatoes - pouches and boxes, juice boxes for the kids (100% juice please).

You can also drop off Giant gift cards at the Giant Customer Service desk, and they will hold them for Olney Help.
